4 FOR the purpose of delaying the termination of certain changes to the workers'
5 compensation benefit structure for permanent partial disability in order to continue
6 to exempt loss of the thumb, fingers, and great toe from the lower tier of benefits;
7 and generally relating to delaying the termination of certain changes to the benefit
8 structure for permanent partial disability.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 9-628(d) of the Labor and Employment Article, take effect January 1, 1988 and shall
23 remain in effect for a period of [9] 13 years and, at the end of January 1, [1997] 2001,
