CHAPTER ____

1 AN ACT concerning

- 2 Creation of a State Debt Montgomery County National Capital TrolleyMuseum
- 3 [TAG ftpo]FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$3,000,000
- 4 \$200,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the
- 5 National Capital Historical Museum of Transportation, Inc. for certain acquisition,
- 6 development, or improvement purposes; providing for disbursement of theloan
- 7 proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching
- 8 fund; and providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the
- 9 loan.
- 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, That:
- 12 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
- 13 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Montgomery
- 14 County National Capital Trolley Museum Loan of 1996 in a total principal amount
- 15 equal to the lesser of (i) \$3,000,000 \$200,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund
- 16 provided in accordance with Section 1(5) below. This loan shall be evidenced by the
- 17 issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of
- 18 the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordancewith §§ 8-117
- 19 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the
- 20 Code.
- 21 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan maybe sold as a
- 22 single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under §
- 23 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 24 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and
- 25 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the
- 26 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on

- 1 the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works,
- 2 for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects'and engineers' fees:
- 3 as a grant to the Board of Directors of the National Capital Historical Museum of
- 4 Transportation, Inc. (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee") for the final
- 5 planning and design and for the construction and equipping of a new facility for the
- 6 design of the National Capital Trolley Museum in Silver Spring, including correction of
- 7 the original design of the railway and relocation of part of it, improvement of access to
- 8 the upper car house, creation of a new visitors center with additional space for
- 9 educational activities, alternative construction for compliance with the access
- 10 requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act, and other improvements, the
- 11 construction of this new facility in a different section of the currentsite having been made
- 12 necessary by highway improvements in the area.
- 13 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in rate 14 and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and when due 15 and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of 16 issuance of the bonds.
- 17 (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the
- 18 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching
- 19 fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or
- 20 indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. The fund
- 21 may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the
- 22 effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or
- 23 what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of PublicWorks shall
- 24 determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee hasuntil June 1,
- 25 1998, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund
- 26 will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and
- 27 the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan
- 28 equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in
- 29 this Act. Any amount of the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund certified
- 30 by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no further effect.
- 31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 32 June 1, 1996.
