A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Rubble Landfills - Recycling Plan

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that a permit holder for a rubble landfillsubmit to the

- 4 Department of the Environment and a certain approving authority a certain
- 5 recycling plan by a certain date; requiring that the recycling plan receive certain
- 6 approval before implementation; providing that a permit holder recycle certain
- 7 materials to the extent legally allowed and economically feasible; requiring that a
- 8 permit holder submit a certain report to the Department and the approving
- 9 authority; defining a certain term; and generally relating to recycling plans for
- 10 rubble landfills.

11 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

16 BY adding to

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 23 Article Environment
- 24 9-1701.
- 25 (h) "Recyclable materials" means those materials that:
- 26 (1) Would otherwise become solid waste for disposal in a refusedisposal
- 27 system; and
- (2) May be collected, separated, or processed and returned to themarketplace in the form of raw materials or products.

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1 (i) (1) "Recycling" means any process in which materials that would otherwise 2 become solid waste are collected, separated, or processed and returned to the 3 marketplace in the form of raw materials or products.

4 (2) "Recycling" includes composting.

6 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "APPROVING AUTHORITY" MEANS THE UNIT OF
7 GOVERNMENT IN A LOCAL JURISDICTION RESPONSIBLE FOR SOLID WASTE
8 MANAGEMENT WITHIN THE LOCAL JURISDICTION.

9 (B) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 1996, A PERMIT HOLDER OF A RUBBLE
10 LANDFILL SHALL SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT AND THE APPROVING AUTHORITY
11 A RECYCLING PLAN FOR THE ON-SITE OR OFF-SITE RECYCLING OF RECYCLABLE
12 MATERIALS.

13 (C) THE RECYCLING PLAN MAY NOT BE IMPLEMENTED UNTIL THE PERMIT14 HOLDER RECEIVES THE APPROVAL OF THE APPROVING AUTHORITY.

15 (D) A PERMIT HOLDER SHALL SEPARATE AND RECYCLE ALL RECYCLABLE16 MATERIALS TO THE EXTENT LEGALLY ALLOWED AND ECONOMICALLY FEASIBLE.

17 (E) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, A PERMIT HOLDER SHALL
18 SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT AND THE APPROVING
19 AUTHORITY SPECIFYING THE AMOUNT OF RECYCLING PERFORMED AT THE
20 LANDFILL.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 June 1, 1996.

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
