## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_

## 1 AN ACT concerning

- 2 Creation of a State Debt Baltimore Neighborhood Recreation Facility
- 3 [TAG ftpo]FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of \$1,200,000
- 4 \$400,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Mayor and City Council of
- 5 Baltimore for certain acquisition, development, or improvement purposes; providing
- 6 for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee
- 7 provide and expend a matching fund; and providing generally for the issuance and
- 8 sale of bonds evidencing the loan.
- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 10 MARYLAND, That:
- 11 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
- 12 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Baltimore
- 13 Neighborhood Recreation Facility Loan of 1996 in the total principal amount of
- 14 \$1,200,000 \$400,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of
- 15 State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works
- 16 and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 of the State
- 17 Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.
- 18 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan maybe sold as a
- 19 single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under §
- 20 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 21 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and
- 22 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the
- 23 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on
- 24 the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works,
- 25 for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects'and engineers' fees:
- 26 as a grant to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore (referred to hereafter in this Act

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- 1 as "the grantee") for the repair, renovation, and modernization, including upgrading of
- 2 parts of the existing structure, of the Baltimore Neighborhood Recreation Facility,
- 3 located at 1601 Pennsylvania Avenue in Baltimore.
- 4 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in rate 5 and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and when due 6 and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of 7 issuance of the bonds.
- 8 (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the
  9 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide andexpend a matching
  10 fund of \$120,000 \$40,000. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either
  11 directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated.
  12 No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended
  13 prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the
  14 matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of
  15 Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee
  16 has until June 1, 1998, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that
  17 a matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall
  18 certify this fact to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan shall be expended for
  19 the purposes provided in this Act.
- 20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 June 1, 1996.
