(a) There is a Hagerstown-Washington County Economic DevelopmentCommission.
17 (b) The purpose of the Commission is to:
18 (1) Advance the general welfare of the people through programs and 19 activities to develop Washington County's natural resources and economic opportunities 20 pertaining to commerce, agriculture, forestry, mineral extraction and processing, 21 transportation, travel, tourism, and recreation;
22 (2) Cooperate and offer assistance to and encourage the retention and 23 expansion of existing industries and businesses in Washington County;
 (3) Promote and encourage the establishing and locating of new industries and businesses in Washington County; and
26 (4) Undertake other activities intended to foster and develop gainful 27 employment and the quality of life of all who are residents of Washington County.]

29 (a) (1) The Commission consists of not more than 25 members.
30 (2) Of the members:
31 (i) The Mayor and City Council of Hagerstown may appoint not more 32 than 10 members; and

(ii) The Washington County Commissioners may appoint not more

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	(3) (i) The members shall represent a cross-section of the economic composition of Washington County and shall be selected because of theirknown interest and expertise in economic development.
	(ii) It is advisable to select members that represent commerce, industry, health services, agriculture, banking, construction, labor, real estate, retailing, transportation, utilities, service industries, and the professions.
7 8	(b) (1) The Commission shall establish a nominating Committee to fill vacancies on the Commission.
9 10	(2) The nominating Committee shall forward to the Commission the names of at least 2 nominees to fill a vacancy on the Commission.
11 12	(3) The Commission may approve or disapprove the recommendations of the nominating Committee.
15	(4) If the Commission approves the qualifications of the candidates, the Commission shall submit a list of nominees to the County Commissioners and a separate list of nominees to the Mayor and City Council for approval or disapproval by the appropriate appointing authority.
	(c) In appointing a member to fill a vacancy, the appropriate appointing authority, either the County Commissioners or the Mayor and City Council shall give reasonable and fair consideration to the nominations submitted by the Commission.]

21	(a) (1) The term of a member is 4 years.
22	(2) (i) A member may be appointed to 1 additional term of 4 years.
23 24	(ii) After serving two 4-year terms, a member may not be reappointed until at least 1 year has elapsed.
25 26	(3) The terms of the members are staggered as determined by each appointing authority.
27 28	(b) Each member shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary travel and other expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
29 30	(c) (1) The Commission shall select from its own membership a chairman and a vice-chairman to serve a term of $1\ \text{year}$.
31 32	(2) (i) The chairman and vice-chairman may be appointed to 1 additional term of 1 year.
33 34	(ii) After serving 2 1-year terms as chairman or vice-chairman, a member may not be reappointed to that office until at least 1 year has elapsed.
35 36	(d) The Commission may establish standing committees as necessary toconduct the business of the Commission.

(e) (1) There is an executive committee of the Commission.

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1	(2) The members of the executive committee are:
2	(i) The chairman of the Commission;
3	(ii) The vice-chairman of the Commission; and
4	(iii) Any chairman of a standing committee.
5 6	(3) The executive director of the Commission is an ex officio member of the executive committee.
9	(f) Upon the death, disability, resignation, or removal of any member of the Commission, the County Commissioners, or the Mayor and City Council shall appoint a person in accordance with the nomination and appointment procedures setforth in § 9-102 of this subtitle to serve for the unexpired term.
11 12	(g) The following individuals are nonvoting ex officio members of the Commission:
13	(1) The resident State Senator;
14 15	(2) The chairman of the Washington County delegation of the House of Delegates;
16	(3) The President of the County Commissioners;
17	(4) 1 member of the County Commissioners;
18	(5) The Mayor of Hagerstown; and
19	(6) 1 member of the City Council.]

21 22	(a) The Commission shall meet at least 10 times each year and shall hold special meetings at the call of the chairman or of any 3 members of the Commission.
23 24	(b) The Commission shall adopt regulations necessary to govern its procedure and business.
25	(c) (1) A simple majority constitutes a quorum.
26 27	(2) All actions of the Commission shall be approved by a majority of the members present and authorized to vote.
	(d) (1) The Commission shall submit for review to the County Commissioners and Mayor and City Council an annual operating budget for the fiscal year, with final approval by the County Commissioners.
31 32	(2) The funding of the Commission shall be as agreed upon by the County Commissioners and Mayor and City Council.
33 34	(e) (1) The Commission shall employ an executive director and may employ other employees as its business may require within the limits of its appropriation.

1 2	(2) The Executive Director and other employees of the Commission are employees of the County Commissioners.]

4 5	(a) The Commission shall file annual reports with the County Commissioners and Mayor and City Council. The reports shall be available to the public.
	(b) The annual report shall include subjects and recommendations for the improvement and advancement of the economic welfare of the people of Washington County.]

11 12	(1) Investigate and assemble information and statistics pertinent to the economic resources and industrial opportunities of the county;
13 14	(2) Encourage location of new industrial and business enterprises in the county and the retention and expansion of present enterprises;
	(3) Encourage development of recreational areas and encourage tourist business in the county, making the public aware of the county's historical background and progress;
18 19	(4) Disseminate information in the interest of industrial and business development by publication, advertising, and other means;
	(5) Cooperate with any federal, State, local agency, board, or commission, including the Maryland Department of Economic and Employment Development, in the furtherance of its purposes;
23 24	(6) Cooperate with any interested private concern, civic organization, or subdivision thereof in furtherance of its purposes; and
	(7) Establish and appoint Advisory Groups and Committees to assist in its program of activity, the membership of which is not restricted to members of the Commission.]
	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Board of County Commissioners of Washington County may provide, by ordinance, for the establishment, membership, procedures, powers, and duties of an economic development commission.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 4 2 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 1996, contingent on the enactment of an ordinance by the Board of County Commissioners of Washington County that provides for the establishment, membership, procedures, powers, and duties of an economic development commission, and if the Board of County Commissioners does not enact an ordinance that so provides, Section 1 of this Act shall be mull and void without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly. The Board of County Commissioners shallforward a copy of the enacted ordinance to the Department of Legislative Reference, 90 State Circle, Annapolis, Maryland 21401.

- SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2, subject to Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 1996.
