A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Washington County - Hotel Tax - Civil War Tourism

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the rate of the hotel tax imposed in Washington County for
- 4 a certain fiscal year; providing for the distribution of the additional revenue
- 5 collected under this Act; requiring the Board of County Commissioners of
- 6 Washington County to include a certain appropriation in the county budget for a
- 7 certain fiscal year; requiring a certain convention and visitors bureau to submit a
- 8 certain report on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the use of a part
- 9 of the hotel tax revenue collected in Washington County to promote Civil War

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 Article 24 - Political Subdivisions - Miscellaneous Provisions

- 20 (a) Subject to the limitations in subsections (b) and (c) of this section, the hotel
- 21 rental tax rate is the rate that the authorized county sets by resolution.
- 22 (b) An authorized county may not set a hotel rental tax rate that exceeds:
- 23 (1) 3% in a code county;
- 24 (2) 5% in Calvert County;
- 25 (3) 3% in Cecil County;
- 26 (4) 5% in Charles County;
- 27 (5) 4% in Dorchester County;
- 28 (6) 5% in Garrett County;

HOUSE BILL 1394 2 1 (7) 5% in St. Mary's County; 2 (8) 3% in Somerset County; 3 (9) 3% in Talbot County; (10) 3% in Washington County; and 4 5 (11) 5% in Wicomico County. 6 (c) Notwithstanding subsection (b)(1) of this section, a code countymay set a 7 hotel rental tax rate that is greater than 3%, but not exceeding 5%, with the unanimous 8 consent of the county commissioners for the county. 9 9-318. 10 (b) (4) Washington County: 11 (i) May not deduct more than 5% of the revenue for administrative 12 costs under subsection (a)(1) of this section; and 13 (ii) Shall deposit all remaining revenues, after the distribution under 14 subsection (a)(1) of this section, in the general funds of Washington County to underwrite 15 the Washington County tourism budget and, when established, the Washington County 16 Convention Bureau. 17 (c) An authorized county shall make the distributions required underthis section 18 between the 15th day and the 30th day of each calendar month. 19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding Article 20 24, §§ 9-304 and 9-318 of the Annotated Code of Maryland: 21 (1) for Fiscal Year 1997, the rate of the hotel tax imposed in Washington 22 County shall be 3.5%; 23 (2) the additional revenue collected as a result of the increase in the tax rate 24 under paragraph (1) of this section of this Act shall be distributed to the City of 25 Hagerstown to be used for advertising and marketing expenses for promoting Civil War 26 tourism in the Washington County area; 27 (3) the Board of County Commissioners of Washington County shall include 28 in the county's budget for Fiscal Year 1998 an appropriation to the 29 Hagerstown/Washington County Convention and Visitors Bureau of \$55,000, for the 30 purpose of continuing the funding for advertising and marketing expenses for promoting 31 Civil War tourism; and

37 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 38 July 1, 1996.
