16	(a) There is a Class 7 micro-brewery (on- and off-sale) license.	
17	(b) The license shall be issued:	
18	(1) By the State Comptroller;	
19	(2) Only in the following jurisdictions:

23	(iv) The City of Annapolis;

	(3) Only to a holder of a Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license that is is issued for use on the premises of a restaurant located in a jurisdiction listed in paragraph (2) of this subsection.
8	(c) (1) A holder of a Class 7 micro-brewery license:
Ģ	(i) May brew and bottle malt beverages at a single location; and
1	0 (ii) May not brew more than 10,000 barrels of malt beverage each 1 calendar year.
1	2 (2) In Allegany County only, the holder of a Class 7 license:
1 1	3 (i) May brew in one location and may contract for the bottling of the 4 malt beverage in another location; and
1 1	(ii) Need not meet the hotel/motel requirements for a Class B beer, wine and liquor licensee but shall meet the requirements for those Class B restaurants.
1 1	7 (d) (1) The on-sale privilege authorizes the holder to sell at retail beer brewed 8 under this license to customers for consumption on the licensed premises.
1 2	9 (2) The off-sale privilege authorizes the holder to sell and deliver beer 0 brewed under this license to:
2	1 (i) Any wholesaler licensed under this article to sell beer in this State; 2 or
2 2	3 (ii) Any person who is located in a state other than Maryland who is 4 authorized under the laws of that state to receive brewed beverages.
	(3) (I) [In] THIS PARAGRAPH APPLIES ONLY IN the City of Annapolis, 6 Anne Arundel County, Baltimore City, Baltimore County, Charles County, FREDERICK 7 COUNTY, Howard County, and Prince George's County [only, the].
	(II) THE holder may sell at retail beer brewed under this license to 9 customers for consumption off the licensed premises in refillable containers that are 0 sealed by the micro-brewery licensee at the time of each refill.
3	1 (e) A holder of a Class 7 micro-brewery license:
3	2 (1) May not own, operate or be affiliated with any other manufacturer of 3 beer; and
3	4 (2) Notwithstanding § 2-201(b) of this article, may not be granted a

35 wholesale alcoholic beverages license.
