- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 16 (A) The Commission consists of [five] THE FOLLOWING commissioners[,]:
- 17 (1) ONE COMMISSIONER REPRESENTING AND RESIDING IN EACH
- 18 CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT IN THE STATE; AND
- 19 (2) ONE COMMISSIONER AT LARGE.
- 20 (B) THE COMMISSIONERS SHALL BE appointed by the Governor with the advice
