2 Noxious Weed - Purple Loosestrife

- 3 FOR the purpose of designating purple loosestrife as a noxious weed in the State.
- 4 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 5 Article Agriculture
- 6 Section 9-401
- 7 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 8 (1985 Replacement Volume and 1995 Supplement)

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 Article - Agriculture

- 12 9-401.
- 13 (a) The existence of growth of certain species of plants is declared to be noxious.
- 14 (b) The following plants are considered to be noxious weeds in the State:
- 15 (1) Thistles belonging to the asteraceae or compositae family, including
- 16 Canada, musk, nodding, plumeless, and bull thistle;
- 17 (2) Johnson grass (sorghum halepense) or hybrids that contain Johnson
- 18 grass as a parent; [and]
- 19 (3) Shatter cane and wild cane (sorghum bicolor); AND
- 20 (4) PURPLE LOOSESTRIFE (LYTHRUM SALICARIA).
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 October 1, 1996.
