A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Nursing Assistants - Training and Certification

3 FOR the purpose of requiring an individual to meet certain training andcertification

- 4 requirements established by the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene before
- 5 acting as a nursing assistant; establishing minimum training requirements; providing
- 6 for a certain application of this Act; defining certain terms; requiring the Secretary
- 7 to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to the training and certification
- 8 of nursing assistants.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 Article - Health Occupations

22 8-507.1.

23 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS24 INDICATED.

25 (2) "HEALTH CARE FACILITY" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 19-101 OF 26 THE HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE.

27 (3) "NURSING ASSISTANT" MEANS A NURSES' AIDE, PATIENT CARE
28 TECHNICIAN, ORDERLY, ATTENDANT, OR OTHER SUPPORTIVE PERSONNEL
29 EMPLOYED BY A HEALTH CARE FACILITY TO PERFORM PATIENT CARE TASKS FOR

1 PATIENTS UNDER THE DIRECTION AND IMMEDIATE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED 2 NURSE.

3 (B) AN INDIVIDUAL MUST MEET THE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION
4 REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY THE SECRETARY BEFORE ACTING AS A NURSING
5 ASSISTANT IN A HEALTH CARE FACILITY.

6 (C) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING TRAINING 7 AND CERTIFICATION OF NURSING ASSISTANTS.

8 (D) (1) TRAINING MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF9 THIS SECTION MUST BE IN A PROGRAM APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY.

(2) TRAINING SHALL INCLUDE AT LEAST 102 HOURS OF COURSE WORK,
 HALF OF WHICH SHALL BE CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION AND HALF OF WHICH SHALL
 BE SUPERVISED CLINICAL EXPERIENCE IN LONG-TERM CARE.

(3) THE COURSE CONTENT OF THE PROGRAM SHALL FOLLOW THE
 CURRICULUM REQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR GERIATRIC NURSING
 ASSISTANTS IN COMPREHENSIVE CARE FACILITIES AND EXTENDED CARE
 FACILITIES.

(4) A HEALTH CARE FACILITY THAT EMPLOYS NURSING ASSISTANTS
 MAY OFFER THE TRAINING REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION, IF THE TRAINING
 PROGRAM HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY.

20 (E) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS PROVIDING FOR THE
21 EVALUATION AND CERTIFICATION OF THE COMPETENCY OF NURSING ASSISTANTS,
22 INCLUDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NURSING ASSISTANT REGISTRY.

23 Article - Health - General

24 19-308.1.

(a) (1) In this section "patient care personnel" means an individual whom arelated institution employs to provide health related or personal care services.

(2) "Patient care personnel" does not include an individual whoprovides
general administrative, nonmedical supervisory, or recordkeeping services in a related
institution.

(B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO AN INDIVIDUAL CERTIFIED AS ANURSING ASSISTANT UNDER § 8-507.1 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.

[(b)] (C) The Secretary may adopt reasonable rules and regulations that set
 minimum qualifications for patient care personnel who are not licensed under the Health
 Occupations Article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That individuals employed on
October 1, 1996 by a health care facility to perform patient care tasksfor patients under
the direction and immediate supervision of a licensed nurse shall be required to comply
with the certification and training requirements of § 8-507.1 of the Health Occupations
Article as of October 1, 1997.
