### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

# 1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

#### 2 %Nursing Homes - Alzheimer's Disease - Special Care Disclosure

3 FOR the purpose of urging all facilities providing specialized care or services for people 4 with Alzheimer's disease or related dementias to provide disclosure to consumers and the appropriate licensing agency or agencies regarding these specialized 5

6 services.

7 WHEREAS, Long-term care for persons with Alzheimer's disease and related 8 dementias needs to be different from the skilled care required by many nursing home 9 residents, or the care and supervision of cognitively intact individuals in residential or 10 other settings; and

11 WHEREAS, Appropriate Alzheimer's care requires a focus on the psychological 12 needs of the individual and provides specific, therapeutic activities and programs designed to maximize the individual's remaining cognitive and physical abilities and to 13 14 manage the difficult behaviors that are often symptoms of the disease. Inappropriate care 15 results in increased disability and severely reduced quality of life for individuals with 16 Alzheimer's; and

17 WHEREAS, A large number of nursing home and assisted living/domiciliary care 18 residents have dementia, and more facilities nationally and in Marylandare marketing special care units and programs. A study conducted throughout the United States by the 19 20 National Alzheimer's Association found that a significant percentage of these units and 21 programs do not provide specialized care or activities, do not adapt the environment to 22 meet the patient's needs, do not have appropriate furnishings, do not advise families of 23 alternatives, do not involve families in care and decisions, and do notdiscuss how staffs 24 are selected and trained for the program; now, therefore, be it

25 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That any 26 facility which offers to provide or provides specialized care or services for people with 27 Alzheimer's disease or related dementias by means of an Alzheimer's special care unit/program are urged to provide disclosure to consumers, and the appropriate licensing 28 29 agency or agencies, regarding these specialized services; and be it further

30 RESOLVED, That it is in the public interest to provide for the protection of 31 consumers regarding the accuracy and authenticity of claims by facilities providing special 32 care for persons who have Alzheimer's disease or related dementias, andthat such 33 facilities are urged to disclose the reasons for those claims, to keep records of such

disclosures, and to report all related information to the appropriate State licensing agency
or agencies for examination of the records; and be it further
