HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 Committee to Review the Impact of the Federal Balanced Budget Amendment

- 3 FOR the purpose of calling for the creation of a legislative Committee to Review the
- 4 Impact of the Federal Balanced Budget Amendment to determine the effect such
- 5 an Amendment would have on the budget and programs of the State and local
- 6 jurisdictions; providing for the membership and other technical aspects of the
 - Committee; and generally relating to a Committee to Review the Impact of the
- 8 Federal Balanced Budget Amendment.
- 9 WHEREAS, The Congress, pursuant to the procedures set forth in Article V of the
- 10 Constitution of the United States, has proposed an Amendment to that Constitution,
- 11 known as the Balanced Budget Amendment, and that proposed Amendment maycome
- 12 before the General Assembly of Maryland, which would have seven years in which to
- 13 ratify it; and

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- 14 WHEREAS, The General Assembly shares the concern of the Congress and
- 15 citizens of Maryland regarding the high national debt and national budget deficit and the
- 16 need to constrain and reduce that debt; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Some persons support an Amendment to the Constitution of the
- 18 United States as the appropriate manner in which to constrain the national debt, citing
- 19 the successful history of such provisions in state constitutions; and
- WHEREAS, Other persons argue that such an Amendment is not the appropriate
- 21 method for reducing the national debt and cite differences between the role of the public
- 22 budgets at the national and state level, and the differences between the requirements in
- 23 the proposed Amendment and the provisions of such amendments in the states, including
- 24 the role of capital as well as operating fund budgets; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Maryland is among the top states in both grants received from the
- 26 federal government and per capita federal employees and would, therefore, feel a
- 27 disproportionate impact from drastic reductions in the federal budget that would be
- 28 required to comply with the provisions of the proposed Amendment; and
- 29 WHEREAS, The actual impact of the proposed Amendment on the budget and
- 30 programs of the State and local governments in Maryland, the economy of the State, and
- 31 the impact on the citizens of our State have not been studied or evaluated as they should
- 32 be prior to action on ratification; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the

- 2 Speaker of the House of Delegates and the President of the Senate of Maryland are
- 3 requested to appoint a Committee to Review the Impact of the Federal Balanced Budget
- 4 Amendment on the State of Maryland, to review the impact of the proposed Amendment
- 5 on Maryland, including the direct and indirect impacts on the State's economy and on the
- 6 budgets and programs of the State and local jurisdictions, including the impact of both
- 7 the federal deficit reductions and the public funding cuts and program eliminations
- 8 necessitated by the Amendment, and the impact of reductions in direct non-State
- 9 assistance, such as Medicare, on citizens of Maryland; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Committee be composed of members of the Senate and
- 11 Houses of Delegates of the General Assembly, with each Chamber having aco-chair, and
- 12 of representatives of both political parties, and shall be supported byappropriate
- 13 Legislative and Executive Branch staff; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Committee conduct public hearings as appropriate and
- 15 report on its findings to the Legislative Policy Committee of the General Assembly no
- 16 later than December 15, 1996. The findings should include the range of potential
- 17 economic, budgetary, and programmatic impacts of the proposed federal Balanced
- 18 Budget Amendment on Maryland and the manner in which the proposed Amendment is
- 19 similar to and differs from the provisions in the Maryland Constitutionthat relate to the
- 20 long-standing balanced budget requirement for our State; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 22 Legislative Reference to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland; the
- 23 Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and the
- 24 Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
