## 1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

## 2 Privilege for Legislative Casework Communications

3 FOR the purpose of calling on the General Assembly of Virginia to file a Friend of the

- 4 Court brief in a pending civil action involving official actions of a member of the
- 5 Maryland General Assembly; urging the General Assembly of Virginia to support a
- 6 broad reading of legislative and other privileges to include casework
- 7 communications and constituency service; and generally relating to privileged
- 8 communications.

9 WHEREAS, In November 1995, a suit was filed in Virginia against a former 10 member of the General Assembly of Maryland for alleged defamatory communications 11 made in 1994 pursuant to his official duty of representing and helping a constituent; and

WHEREAS, This lawsuit, Chaplin, Papa & Gonet v. Kevin Kelly (Case No.
 766CL95ML3968-00) is pending in the Circuit Court for the City of Richmond,
 Manchester Division; and

WHEREAS, The Attorney General's Office in representing the former member has asserted that casework communications on behalf of a constituent to government officials and regulators are absolutely privileged and, thus, no liability may attach to a legislator

18 for such communications; and

WHEREAS, The Constitutions of both Virginia and Maryland recognize absolutelegislative privilege and the right to petition the government for the address of grievances;and

WHEREAS, Recognition of a broad privilege for legislative casework
communications will benefit Virginia citizens and members of the Virginia General
Assembly by encouraging legislators to vigorously represent their constituents without
fear of civil liability; now, therefore, be it
