A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Senatorial and House of Delegates Scholarship Programs - Abolition

3 FOR the purpose of abolishing the Senatorial Scholarship and House of Delegates

- 4 Scholarship Programs; permitting the recipients of certain scholarships to continue
- 5 to receive those awards under certain conditions; prohibiting the Governor from
- 6 including certain new appropriations in the State budget for certainpurposes;
- 7 transferring certain appropriated but unexpended scholarship funds in the
- 8 Programs, after a certain date, to the General Fund under certain circumstances;
- 9 and generally relating to the abolition of the Senatorial Scholarship and House of
- 10 Delegates Scholarship Programs.
- 11 BY repealing
- 12 Article Education
- 13 Section 18-401 through 18-409, inclusive, and the subtitle "Subtitle4. Senatorial
- 14 Scholarships"; and 18-501 through 18-507, inclusive, and the subtitle "Subtitle
- 15 5. Delegate Scholarships"
- 16 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 17 (1992 Replacement Volume and 1995 Supplement)

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 Article Education
- 21 [Subtitle 4. Senatorial Scholarships.]
- 22 [18-401.
- 23 There is a program of senatorial scholarships in this State that areawarded under 24 this subtitle.]
- 25 [18-402.

26 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, eachapplicant 27 for a senatorial scholarship shall:

1 2	(i) Take a competitive examination administered by the Administration; and
5	(ii) Be accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate, graduate, or professional program at an eligible institution; or be enrolled in a2-year terminal certificate program in which the course work is acceptable for transfercredit for an accredited baccalaureate program in an eligible institution.
7	(2) An applicant is exempt from the examination if the applicant:
8 9	(i) Is attending an eligible institution and has completed at least 1 year in good academic standing at the institution;
10 11	(ii) Graduated from high school at least 5 years before application for a senatorial scholarship;
14	(iii) Is accepted for admission to a private career institution, if the institution's curriculum is approved by the Commission, and the institution is accredited by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education; or
16 17	(iv) Is planning to attend or is attending a Maryland community college.
18	(b) Each applicant shall:
19	(1) Be a resident of this State; and
20 21	(2) At the time of his initial application, be a resident of the legislative district from which he seeks an appointment.
22 23	(c) (1) Each applicant shall demonstrate to the Administration a definite financial need, and each Senator shall consider the financial need of each applicant.
	(2) Each Senator is the final judge of the financial need of each applicant to whom he awards a scholarship, and the Administration may not negate this judgment or impose requirements of time or procedure.
27	(d) Each applicant shall accept any other conditions attached to theaward.]
28	[18-403.
	If a Senator serves from a legislative district comprised of more than one county the number of scholarship units shall be divided as equally as possible among qualified applicants from each county in the legislative district.]
32	[18-404.
33	(a) Each Senator may award \$34,500 of senatorial scholarships each year.
34 35	(b) (1) The annual allocation under subsection (a) of this section applies to initial-year awards. After 4 years of operation, the annual allocation to each Senator for

36 initial-year and continuing awards may not exceed four times the amount f his allocation

37 under subsection (a) of this section.

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1 (2) If a recipient moves to the legislative district of anotherSenator, the 2 allocation to the recipient shall continue to be drawn on the account of the Senator who 3 originally awarded the scholarship.

4 (c) (1) A senatorial scholarship may be awarded in \$100 increments. However, 5 an award for a single year may not be less than \$400 or more than \$2,000.

6 (2) A recipient may not be awarded more than \$8,000 for undergraduate, 7 graduate, or professional study.]

8 [18-405.

9 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a senatorial scholarship 10 may be used only at any undergraduate, graduate, or professional schoolin the State.

11 (b) A senatorial scholarship may be used:

(1) If the curriculum is approved by the Commission, at a degree granting
institution of higher education, a hospital diploma school for trainingregistered nurses,
or to attend a private postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a
national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education
as a full-time student; and

17 (2) For educational expenses as defined by the Administration, includin	ng:
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18 (i) Tuition and mandatory fees; and

19 (ii) Room and board.

20 (c) If on-campus housing is available, a senatorial scholarship may not be used to 21 pay for off-campus housing.

(d) Each Senator may award not more than 10 percent of the funds available
under this subtitle to applicants planning to attend accredited undergraduate, graduate,
or professional institutions outside the State, provided the applicant:

25 (1) Will be studying in an academic area that is not available in the State; or

(2) Is a hearing impaired person who will be studying at an institution
outside the State that makes special provisions for hearing impaired students, and
comparable special provisions are not available to that student at an institution in the
State.]

30 [18-406.

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each recipient of a senatorial
scholarship may hold the scholarship for 4 undergraduate academic years and 4 graduate
academic years if he:

34 (1) Is a full-time student;

35 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and

(3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 12 2 semester hours of courses as an undergraduate or 9 semester hours of courses as a 3 graduate student each semester leading to a degree. (b) A recipient of an undergraduate or graduate senatorial scholarship may hold 5 the scholarship, appropriately prorated, for 8 academic years if he: (1) Is a part-time student; (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 6 semester 9 hours of courses each semester leading to a degree. (c) Any recipient of a senatorial scholarship may use up to one-halfof the yearly 11 award for summer school if the recipient is scheduled to graduate immediately after the 12 fall academic semester following summer school. (d) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate program as provided in § 18-402(a) may hold the scholarship for 2 yearsif he is a 15 full-time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a) of this section, or 16 may hold the scholarship for 4 years if he is a part-time student and otherwise meets the 17 conditions of subsection (b) of this section. (e) Each recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a private 19 postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national accrediting 20 association approved by the United States Department of Education: (1) May hold the scholarship for the completion of 1 program if the student 22 otherwise meets the conditions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of subsection (a) of this section; 23 and (2) Shall complete the program within the length of time prescribed by the 25 institution for the completion of the program.] 26 [18-407. (a) Each Senator shall award all of his senatorial scholarships on or before 28 September 1 of each year. (b) If any Senator fails to award all of his scholarships on or before September 1 30 of each year, the Commission shall make the remaining awards to applicants from the 31 Senator's legislative district who: (1) Scored highest on the competitive examination; or (2) Are attending an eligible institution and have completed atleast 1 year 34 in good academic standing. (c) The Administration shall: (1) Notify each Senator of the applicants to whom it awards the Senator's 37 scholarships; and (2) Announce publicly the names of all recipients.

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1 (d) To the extent a scholarship awarded under § 18-404 of this subtitle is not used 2 by a student, moneys appropriated to the Commission for that award not used by the end 3 of the fiscal year shall be retained by the Commission for use by the awarding Senator in 4 the Senatorial Scholarship Program during subsequent fiscal years.]

5 [18-408.

6 (a) If there is no qualified applicant in a legislative district, a qualified applicant7 who resides in another legislative district may be appointed to receive the senatorial8 scholarship.

9 (b) A senatorial scholarship awarded under this section is for 1 year. However, a 10 student who receives an appointment under this section is eligible to receive a subsequent 11 appointment for not longer than 3 years.]

12 [18-409.

13 At the request of the Administration, each eligible institution shall provide the 14 Administration with a complete list of all recipients of senatorial scholarships who attend 15 the institution.]

16 [Subtitle 5. Delegate Scholarships.]

17 [18-501.

(a) There is a program of Delegate Scholarships in this State that are awardedunder this subtitle.

20 (b) A scholarship awarded under this subtitle may be used at:

(1) An eligible institution for a program of undergraduate, graduate, orprofessional studies;

(2) An accredited undergraduate, graduate, or professional institution
outside the State, if the applicant will be studying in an academic area that is not available
in this State; and

26 (3) A private career school within the State that is approved by the
27 Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11-202 of this article andthat is
28 accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United States
29 Department of Education.

(c) Moneys appropriated to the Commission for scholarships awarded under this
section that are not used by the end of the fiscal year shall be retained by the Commission
for use by the awarding Delegate in the Delegate Scholarship Program during subsequent
fiscal years.]

34 [18-502.

Each member of the House of Delegates may select the recipients of the scholarships on any basis that the Delegate considers appropriate.]

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1 [18-503.

2 (a) During each term in office, each Delegate may award the equivalent of four
3 4-year full-time scholarships, which may be awarded for either 1-, 2-, 3-, or 4-year
4 periods.

5 (b) (1) Each scholarship pays the tuition and mandatory fees at any eligible 6 institution.

7 (2) The annual amount of a scholarship at a private institution any
8 graduate or professional program may not exceed the equivalent annual tuition and
9 mandatory fees of an undergraduate program at the University of Maryland.]

10 [18-504.

(a) A Delegate may award 2 part-time scholarships for each full-timescholarshipavailable.

(b) A part-time scholarship may not be for more than twice as many years as afull-time scholarship.

(c) Each recipient of a part-time scholarship shall carry at least 6semester hoursof courses each semester in a program leading to a degree.]

17 [18-505.

(a) Each recipient of a full-time Delegate Scholarship may use the scholarship toattend summer school.

(b) The term of a full-time Delegate Scholarship shall be shortened by one-half21 year for each summer of use.

(c) The amount used for summer school may not exceed one half of thevalue ofthe award for the next academic year.]

24 [18-506.

(a) As an alternative to the scholarship awards authorized by §§ 18-503 through
18-505 of this subtitle, and subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section,
during each year in office each Delegate may award scholarships in a total amount equal
to four times the tuition and mandatory fees for a full-time undergraduate student
enrolled at the University of Maryland at College Park for the academicyear commencing
in that year.

31 (b) A scholarship award under subsection (a) of this section:

(1) May not be for an amount less than \$200 or more than one-half of thetotal amount of scholarships authorized by subsection (a) for that year;

34 (2) Shall be used at an eligible institution;

35 (3) May be used by:

36 (i) A graduate, undergraduate, or professional student; or

(ii) A student at a private career school within the Statethat is
 approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11-202 of this article
 and that is accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United
 States Department of Education; and

5 (4) To the extent it is not used by the student, shall be recredited to the
6 Delegate's scholarship account and may be awarded in the next 12 monthsby that
7 Delegate to another student pursuant to this section.]

8 [18-507.

9 (a) Beginning in Fiscal Year 1996, each Delegate may authorize the State 10 Scholarship Administration to award all or a portion of the funds authorized under this 11 subtitle to eligible recipients of an Educational Excellence Award who reside in the 12 Delegate's legislative district.

(b) In the event that the total number of eligible recipients of an Educational
Excellence Award who reside in the Delegate's legislative district is insufficient to utilize
the total amount of funds available to the Delegate for any fiscal year, the State
Scholarship Administration may, with the consent of the Delegate, awardthe unused
funds to other eligible recipients throughout the State.]

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding the 19 provisions of this Act, a recipient of a Senatorial Scholarship award or a House of 20 Delegates Scholarship award that is made prior to October 1, 1996 shallcontinue to be 21 eligible to receive the full amount of that scholarship award for the duration of the 22 eligibility period applicable to that recipient.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor may not
 include any new appropriations in the State budget for the Senatorial Scholarship and
 House of Delegates Scholarship Programs unless the appropriation is necessary to carry
 out the requirements of Section 2 of this Act.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any unexpended
appropriation under the Senatorial Scholarship and House of Delegates Scholarship
Programs after October 1, 1996 that is not needed to meet scholarship award
commitments that are made to eligible recipients in accordance with the provisions of

31 Section 2 of this Act shall be transferred to the General Fund.

32 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 33 October 1, 1996.
