1 AN ACT concerning

2 Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages

3 (Class C Beer, Wine and Liquor Licenses)

4 FOR the purpose of exempting Class C beer, wine and liquor club licenses issued \underline{to}

- 5 <u>certain organizations</u> in certain areas of Baltimore City from certain provisions
- 6 generally relating to the issuance and transfer of licenses for the sale of alcoholic
- 7 beverages in Baltimore City; setting a limitation on the effectiveness of this Act; and
- 8 making this Act an emergency measure.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(J) (1) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBSECTION APPLY ONLY UNTIL APRIL 15, 23 24 1997.

(2) THE PROHIBITIONS OF THIS SECTION DO NOT APPLY TO CLASS C 25 26 BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR CLUB LICENSES ISSUED IN THE 1ST PRECINCT OF THE 26TH 27 WARD OF BALTIMORE CITY TO AN ORGANIZATION IN WHICH AT LEAST 75% OF THE 28 MEMBERS ARE PAST OR PRESENT MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE 29 UNITED STATES AND IN WHICH NO PART OF THE ORGANIZATION'S NET EARNINGS 30 INURE TO ANY PRIVATE INDIVIDUAL.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 31 32 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has 33 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 34 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is 35 enacted.
