- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- Unless the individual uses as a title or describes the services the individual provides
- 23 by use of the words "psychological", "psychologist", or "psychology", this title does not
- 24 limit:
- 25 (1) The right of an individual to practice a health occupation that the
- 26 individual is licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized to practice under this article;
- 27 (2) The right of an individual to provide vocational rehabilitation services as
- 28 authorized under Title 9, Subtitle 6 of the Labor and Employment Article;

3	(3) The employment related activities and services of an individual who is employed by an alcohol and drug abuse program or facility that is accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations or that is certified under Title 8, Subtitle 4 of the Health - General Article; or
5 6	(4) The nonprofit activities and services of a bona fide religious organization that is exempt from taxation under $\S 501(c)(3)$ of the Internal Revenue Code.

8 9	(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an individual shall be licensed by the Board before the individual may practice psychology in this State.
10 11	(b) Subject to the rules and regulations of the Board, this section does not apply to:
14	(1) The activities and services of, and the use of an official title by an individual employed by any agency of the federal government, this State, or any political subdivision of this State, or a chartered educational institution whileperforming the duties of that employment;
16 17	(2) The education-related services described in regulations adopted by the State Department of Education that are performed by a certified school psychologist:
18 19	(i) While performing the duties of employment of the certified school psychologist; or
20 21	(ii) While conducting staff development and training workshops for compensation;
	(3) The activities and services of a student, intern, resident or fellow while pursuing a supervised course of study in psychology that the Board approves as qualifying training and experience under this title;
27 28 29 30	(4) The activities and services of an individual while performing psychological services under the direct supervision of a licensed psychologist who takes full responsibility for the activities and services performed, if the supervised individual has graduated from an accredited college or university with at least a master's degree based on a program of studies whose content was primarily psychologicalor a program judged by the Board to be substantially equivalent in subject matter and extent of training to a master's or doctoral degree in psychology, provided that:

13 14	(d) The Board may authorize an unlicensed individual to practice psychology, subject to any limitations the Board imposes, if:
15	(1) The Board finds that the circumstances warrant; and
16	(2) The individual:
17	(i) Is not a resident of this State; and
18 19	(ii) Meets the qualifications, other than residence and examination, for a license.
	(e) The exceptions of subsection (b)(1) of this section do not applyto individuals who are employed by the Department, a county health department, the Baltimore City Health Department, the Department of State Police, or the Department of Public Safety
23 24	and Correctional Services after July 1, 1985. An individual who is employed by any of the departments under this subsection on July 1, 1985 but who is not licensed by the Board shall function under the direct supervision of a licensed psychologist who takes full
	responsibility for the psychological services provided by the individual.
