- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 4-101.
- 20 (A) In this subtitle, "confidential record" means any record, report, statement, 21 note, or other information that:
- 22 (1) Is assembled or obtained for research or study by:
- 23 (i) The Drug Abuse Administration; or
- 24 (ii) The Secretary; and
- 25 (2) Names or otherwise identifies any person.

(B) "CONFIDENTIAL RECORD" DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY RECORD, REPORT,
STATEMENT, NOTE, OR OTHER INFORMATION PERTAINING TO A COMPLETED
INVESTIGATION OF A FOODBORNE OUTBREAK THAT DOES NOT NAME OR
OTHERWISE IDENTIFY AN INDIVIDUAL.

6 (a) (1) Each confidential record shall remain in the custody and control of:

7 (i) The Drug Abuse Administration, if that Administration assembled8 or obtained the confidential record; or

9 (ii) The Secretary or an agent or employee of the Secretary, if the 10 Secretary assembled or obtained the confidential record.

11 (2) The confidential record may be used only for the research and study for 12 which it was assembled or obtained.

(3) A person may not disclose any confidential record to any person who is14 not engaged in the research or study project.

15 (b) This section does not apply to or restrict the use or publication of any

16 statistics, information, or other material that summarizes or refers to confidential records

17 in the aggregate, without disclosing the identity of any person who is the subject of the 18 confidential record.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 1996.
