14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments**

17 18-103.

18 (a) There is an Emergency Number Systems Board in the Department of Public

19 Safety and Correctional Services.

20 (b) The Board has [11] 13 members appointed by the Governor with the advice

21 and consent of the Senate. The members of the Board serve for terms of 4 years each and

22 are as follows:

23 (1) One member representing a telephone utility company operating in

24 Maryland;

25 (2) ONE MEMBER REPRESENTING THE WIRELESS TELEPHONE

26 INDUSTRY IN MARYLAND;

3                   [[3]] (4) One member representing the Department of State Police;

4                   [[4]] (5) One member representing the Maryland Public Service  
5 Commission;

7 Communications Officers;

8                   [[6]] (7) Two members representing the county fire services in Maryland;  
9 one shall represent the career fire services and one shall represent the volunteer fire  
10 services;

11                  [[7]] (8) One member representing police services in Maryland;

12                  [[8]] (9) One member representing emergency management services; and

13                  [[9]] (10) [Two] THREE members representing the public at large.

14                  SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
15 October 1, 1996.
