## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Homicide by Negligent Driving of a Motor Vehicle or Vessel

- 3 FOR the purpose of making it a misdemeanor for a person to cause the death of another
- 4 as the result of the person's negligent driving, operation, or control of a motor
- 5 vehicle or vessel; imposing certain maximum penalties for this offense; making this
- 6 Act applicable only to persons convivcted of offenses after a certain date; and
- 7 generally relating to homicide by negligent driving of a motor vehicle or vessel.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 16 Article 27 Crimes and Punishments
- 17 Manslaughter AND NEGLIGENCE-RELATED HOMICIDES
- 18 388C.
- 19 (A) A PERSON WHO CAUSES THE DEATH OF ANOTHER AS THE RESULT OF THE
- 20 PERSON'S NEGLIGENT DRIVING, OPERATION, OR CONTROL OF A MOTOR VEHICLE
- 21 OR VESSEL IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR TO BE KNOWN AS "HOMICIDE BY
- 22 NEGLIGENT DRIVING OF A MOTOR VEHICLE OR VESSEL".
- 23 (B) A PERSON WHO IS CONVICTED UNDER THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO A
- 24 FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$500 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 180 DAYS OR BOTH.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the provisions of this Act
- 26 shall be construed prospectively to apply only to persons who are convicted of offenses
- 27 that are committed after the effective date of this Act and may not be applied or
- 28 interpreted to have any effect on or application to persons who are convicted of offenses
- 29 that were committed before the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

2 October 1, 1996.
