2 **Blind, Deaf, or Mobility Impaired Pedestrians - Right-of-Way - Penalties**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the number of points that the Motor VehicleAdministration
4 is required to assess against an individual convicted of certain motor vehicle
5 violations related to the failure to yield the right-of-way to blind, deaf, or mobility
6 impaired pedestrians; and generally relating to the penalties for motor vehicle
7 violations.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article - Transportation**

22 (a) After the conviction of an individual for a violation of Article27, § 388 or §
23 388A of the Code, or of the vehicle laws or regulations of this State or of any local
24 authority, points shall be assessed against the individual as of the date of violation and as
25 follows:

26 (1) Any moving violation not listed below and not contributing to an
27 accident 1 point

28 (2) Following another vehicle too closely 2 points

24 (b) If a conviction occurs on multiple charges based on offenses alleged to have
25 been committed at the same time or arising out of circumstances simultaneous in time
26 and place, the Administration:

27 (1) Shall assess points against the individual convicted only on the charge
28 that has the highest point assessment; and

29 (2) May not assess points on the remainder of the multiple charges.

31 (a) The driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to:

32 (1) A blind or partially blind pedestrian using a guide dog or carrying a cane
33 predominantly white or metallic in color (with or without a red tip);

34 (2) A deaf or hearing impaired pedestrian accompanied by a guide dog; or

35 (3) A mobility impaired individual crossing a roadway while using any of the
36 following mobility-assisted devices:

1 (i) A manual or motorized wheelchair;

2 (ii) A motorized scooter;

3 (iii) Crutches; or

4 (iv) A cane.

6 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a
7 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is
8 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 October 1, 1996.
