1 21-511. 2 (a) The driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to: 3 (1) A blind or partially blind pedestrian using a guide dog or carrying a cane 4 predominantly white or metallic in color (with or without a red tip); 5 (2) A deaf or hearing impaired pedestrian accompanied by a guide dog; or (3) A mobility impaired individual crossing a roadway while using any of the 6 7 following mobility-assisted devices: 8 (i) A manual or motorized wheelchair; 9 (ii) A motorized scooter; 10 (iii) Crutches; or (iv) A cane. 11 12 27-101. (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a 13 14 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is 15 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.
