BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments** 13 14 286A. (a) A person who brings into this State any of the following controlled dangerous 15 16 substances which it is unlawful for that person to possess, in the amounts indicated, upon conviction, is subject to the penalty provided in subsection (b) of this section: 18 (1) [100] 10 pounds or greater of marijuana; 19 (2) 28 grams or greater of cocaine or any mixture containing 28grams or 20 greater of cocaine; 21 (3) 4 grams or more of morphine or opium or any derivative, salt, isomer, or 22 salt of an isomer of morphine or opium; (4) 1,000 dosage units of lysergic acid diethylamide or any mixture 23 24 containing the equivalent of 1,000 dosage units of lysergic acid diethylamide;

(5) 28 grams or more of phencyclidine in liquid or powder form or 112 grams

(6) 1,000 dosage units or more of methaqualone;

26 or more of any mixture containing phencyclidine;

- 1 (7) 28 grams or more of methamphetamine or any mixture containing 28 2 grams or more of methamphetamine; or 3 (8) 4 grams or more of fentanyl or a fentanyl analogue.
- 4 (b) A person convicted of violating subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a 5 felony and may be fined not more than \$50,000 or imprisoned for not more than 25 years, 6 or both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 1996.
