2 Commercial Law - Payment by Check - Request for Credit Card Prohibited

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from requesting another person who obtains
4 consumer credit, goods, realty, or services by check or other draft to display a credit
5 card; providing for a certain exception; and generally relating to credit cards.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article - Commercial Law**

14 13-318.

15 (a) (1) In this section, the following words have the meanings indicated.

16 (2) "Drawer" means the individual who makes or signs a check or other
17 draft.

18 (3) "Draft" does not include a credit or debit card sales draft.

19 (b) Subject to [the provisions of] subsection (c) of this section, as a condition of
20 accepting a check or other draft as payment for consumer credit, goods, realty, or
21 services, a person may not request [or record the account number of any credit card of]
22 the drawer of the check or other draft TO DISPLAY A CREDIT CARD.

1 (c) The provisions of this section do not prohibit a person from[:

2 (1) Requesting the drawer to display a credit card for purposes only of
3 identification or credit worthiness;

4 (2) Requesting or recording the type or issuer of a credit card of the drawer;
5 or

6 (3) Recording] RECORDING the number and expiration date of a credit
7 card if the person requesting the information has agreed with the credit card issuer to
8 cash checks as a service to the issuer's cardholders and the issuer has agreed to guarantee
9 payment of cardholder checks cashed by that person.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 1996.
