- 4 FOR the purpose of providing that, under certain circumstances, certainvolunteer
- 5 advanced life support unit members are presumed to have an occupational disease
- 6 that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under the workers'
- 7 compensation law; providing that, under certain circumstances, certain treatment of
- 8 certain individuals who are diagnosed with certain diseases is compensable under
- 9 workers' compensation law; and generally relating to the compensability of

- 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 25 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 26 (2) (i) "On duty" means:
- 27 1. fighting a fire;
- 28 2. performing a duty of a member of an advanced life support
- 29 unit or an ambulance, first aid, or rescue squad in a volunteer company;

1 2	3. except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, performing a duty that the volunteer company assigns to the member;

	(ii) "On duty" does not include attendance of a member of a volunteer company at a social function unless a written bylaw or rule of government adopted for the volunteer company requires the attendance or participation of the member.

- 25 UNIT MEMBER, has met a suitable standard of physical examination beforebecoming a
- 26 fire fighter, fire fighting instructor, or rescue squad member.
