- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 3-216 of this article and upon receipt of an approval of a grant application in the form or

- 23 FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, the Department shall provide grants for paratransit service

10	SECTION 2 AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect

July 1, 1996. <u>It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30.</u>
