## Primary Education - Size of Classes - Establishment of Limitations

FOR the purpose of establishing certain limitations on the number of students that may be enrolled in classes in certain grades; making certain exceptions;requiring the State Superintendent of Schools to enforce certain provisions of law; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt certain regulations; and generallyrelating to the establishment of limitations on the size of classes for kindergartenthrough fifth grade.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article - Education

17 7-112.
(A) THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ENFORCE THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
(B) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF STUDENTS THAT MAY BE ENROLLED IN A CLASS FOR KINDERGARTEN THROUGH FIFTH GRADE SHALL BE:
(1) 25 STUDENTS FOR KINDERGARTEN THROUGH THIRD GRADE; AND
(2) 28 STUDENTS FOR FOURTH AND FIFTH GRADE.
(C) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION DO NOT APPLY TO THE FOLLOWING
(1) VOCAL AND INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC;
(2) ART; AND

2 (D) (1) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT 3 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

4 5 COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OR A COUNTY BOARD TO REQUEST THE STATE BOARD 6 TO EXEMPT A CLASS FROM THE APPLICABLE MANDATORY CLASS SIZE.
(II) A REQUEST FOR AN EXEMPTION SHALL INCLUDE: 10 THE BEGINNING OF THE NEXT SCHOOL YEAR.

11 (III) THE DECISION OF THE STATE BOARD IS FINAL.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 1996.
