AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 3 October 1, 1996. 4 <u>5-103.</u> (d) If a county council or board of county commissioners does not approve the 6 amount requested in the budget that is more than the amount required by \$5-202 of this 7 title[, it]: (1) THE COUNTY COUNCIL OR BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS 9 shall indicate in writing, within 15 days after the adoption of the budget, which major 10 categories of the annual budget have been reduced and the reason for the reduction; AND (2) THE COUNTY BOARD SHALL SUBMIT TO THE COUNTY GOVERNING 12 BODY, WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE ADOPTION OF THE BUDGET, A REPORT 13 INDICATING HOW THE ALTERATIONS TO THE BUDGET WILL BE IMPLEMENTED, 14 ACCOMPANIED BY REASONABLE SUPPORTING DETAIL AND ANALYSIS. 15 <u>5-105.</u> (a) This section does not apply to Baltimore City. 27 (2) A transfer between major categories shall be made only with the 28 approval of the county commissioners or county council. 29 (3) If the county commissioners or county council fail to take action on a 30 request for transfer between major categories within 30 days after the receipt of a written 31 request substantiating the transfer, the failure to take action constitutes approval.

[For] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUB-8 SUBPARAGRAPH 2 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH, FOR purposes of this paragraph, the local 9 appropriation on a per pupil basis for the prior fiscal year for a county is derived by 10 dividing the county's highest local appropriation to its school operating budget for the 11 prior fiscal year by the [full-time equivalent] enrollment [used to calculate the current 12 expense aid] for the county for the prior fiscal year. For example, the calculation of the 13 current expense aid for fiscal year 1985 shall be based on the highest local appropriation 14 for the school operating budget for a county for fiscal year 1984. Program shifts between 15 a county operating budget and a county school operating budget may not be used to 16 artificially satisfy the requirements of this paragraph. 2. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PARAGRAPH, FOR FISCAL 1997 17 18 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE CALCULATION OF THE COUNTY'S 19 HIGHEST LOCAL APPROPRIATION TO ITS SCHOOL OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE 20 PRIOR FISCAL YEAR SHALL EXCLUDE: 21 A. ONE-HALF OF THE AMOUNT BY WHICH THE COUNTY'S 22 LOCAL APPROPRIATION TO THE SCHOOL OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE PRIOR 23 FISCAL YEAR EXCEEDED THE MINIMUM APPROPRIATION REQUIRED FOR THAT 24 FISCAL YEAR UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH; AND 25 B. 2 YEAR. 3 4. THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL INFORM THE 4 COUNTY WHETHER THE WAIVER FOR A FISCAL YEAR IS APPROVED OR DENIED IN 5 WHOLE OR IN PART BY MAY 15 OF THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR. 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 5-101(f) and 7 5-103(e) of Article - Education of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed. 8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of 9 Education, in consultation with the State Superintendent of Schools, shall establish by 10 regulation criteria to evaluate county requests for waivers authorized under § 11 5-202(b)(3)(iv)2 of the Education Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That: 20 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the changes made under this Act 21 to §§ 5-101, 5-103, and 5-105 of the Education Article do not apply to the budgets of the 22 county boards of education until the fiscal year that begins July 1, 1997. 23 (b) For the fiscal year that begins July 1, 1996, a county board shall submit to the 24 county governing body a report at the end of each month if during that month the county 25 board: 26 (1) Makes a transfer authorized under § 5-105(c) of the Education Article; 27 or 28 (2) Makes any policy decision or takes any action that reasonably would be 29 expected to commit the county board to spend more for the current fiscal year in any 30 major category than the amount approved in the annual budget for that category.
