4	FOR the purpose of authorizing the Office on Aging to deny the issuanceor deny,
5	suspend, or revoke certain certificates of applicants or providers of sheltered
6	housing for the elderly and continuing care facilities if the provider has been
7	convicted of or plead guilty or nolo contendere to or have a pendingcriminal case
8	for a crime involving moral turpitude under certain circumstances.

14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:	
16	Article 70B - Office on Aging

18	(b) With respect to the sheltered housing for elderly, the Director shall:
19	(1) Develop sheltered housing for the elderly, in conjunction with any public
20	or private profit or nonprofit corporation or any State or federal agency;
21	(2) Make maximum use of rent and other subsidies available fromfederal
22	and State sources and provide for subsidies necessary from State general funds to assist
23	low income aged to reside in sheltered housing as an alternative to more costly, but not
24	required, institutional care;
25	(3) Find sponsors or managers for sheltered housing projects;
26	(4) Assist developers in formulating design concepts and meeting program

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1 (5) When necessary, provide subsidies for congregate meals, housekeeping, 2 and personal services for sheltered housing, and develop eligibility requirements in 3 connection with these subsidies;

4 (6) Adopt regulations governing the certification and operation of sheltered
5 housing projects, INCLUDING THE DENIAL, SUSPENSION, OR REVOCATION OF A
6 CERTIFICATE OF A PROVIDER WHO HAS BEEN CONVICTED OR HAS PLEAD GUILTY
7 OR NOLO CONTENDERE TO A CRIME INVOLVING MORAL TURPITUDE OR
8 WITHHOLDING A DECISION ON WHETHER TO ISSUE, REVOKE, OR SUSPEND A
9 CERTIFICATE OF AN APPLICANT OR PROVIDER WHO HAS A PENDING CRIMINAL
10 CASE INVOLVING A CRIME OF MORAL TURPITUDE;

(7) Be authorized to conduct federal and State criminal background
investigations of providers of sheltered housing and their employees when the sheltered
housing provides for fewer than 16 unrelated individuals and is operated as a
single-family dwelling;

(8) Adopt regulations which provide for investigations of any criminalrecord of a sheltered housing provider or employee under paragraph (6) of thissubsection;

(9) Certify and review the compliance of sheltered housing projects with theregulations established for governing the certification and operation of these projects;

(10) As a prerequisite to certification and renewal of certification for
providers of sheltered housing for elderly, require each provider of sheltered housing for
elderly who suffer from Alzheimer's Disease and related disorders to have an in-service
education program that includes instruction on dementia and the techniques necessary to
manage dementia patients with regard to their physical, intellectual, and behavioral
manifestations; and

26 (11) Be authorized to impose a civil money penalty against a provider of27 sheltered housing under § 4-I of this article.

(a) A feasibility study approval may be denied for cause by the Office and a
preliminary certificate of registration, certificate of registration, or renewal certificate
may be denied, suspended, or revoked for cause by the Office. Grounds for denial,
suspension, or revocation include violation of the provisions of this subtitle, violations of
rules or regulations issued by the Office pursuant to this subtitle, misrepresentations, or
submissions of any false financial statement. For any denial, suspension, or revocation,
the Office shall set forth its reasons in writing.

36 (B) THE OFFICE MAY DENY, SUSPEND, OR REVOKE A PRELIMINARY
37 CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION, CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION, OR RENEWAL
38 CERTIFICATE OF AN APPLICANT OR PROVIDER WHO HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF OR
39 PLEADS GUILTY OR NOLO CONTENDERE TO A CRIME INVOLVING MORAL
40 TURPITUDE WHETHER OR NOT ANY APPEAL OR OTHER PROCEEDING IS PENDING

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(C) (1) FOR AN APPLICANT OR PROVIDER WHO HAS A PENDING CRIMINAL
 CASE FOR A CRIME INVOLVING MORAL TURPITUDE, THE OFFICE SHALL WITHHOLD
 A DECISION ON WHETHER TO ISSUE, SUSPEND, OR REVOKE A PRELIMINARY
 CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION, CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION, OR RENEWAL
 CERTIFICATE OF THE APPLICANT OR PROVIDER UNTIL THERE HAS BEEN A FINAL
 DISPOSITION OF THE CASE.

7 (2) AFTER THERE HAS BEEN A FINAL DISPOSITION OF THE PROVIDER'S
8 CRIMINAL CASE, THE OFFICE SHALL MAKE A DECISION TO APPROVE OR DENY THE
9 ISSUANCE OF A PRELIMINARY CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION, CERTIFICATE OF
10 REGISTRATION, OR RENEWAL CERTIFICATE TO THE PROVIDER.

11 [(b)] (D) The proceedings governing the appeal of a denial, revocation, or 12 suspension shall be conducted in accordance with the Maryland Administrative 13 Procedure Act.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 1996.
