3	(B) THERE IS A CHILDREN FIRST COMMISSION IN THE OFFICE FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES.
5	(C) (1) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF 15 MEMBERS.
6	(2) OF THE 15 MEMBERS:
	(I) ELEVEN SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR AND SHALI BE REPRESENTATIVE OF SCHOOLS, RECREATIONAL FACILITIES, LIBRARIES, NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATIONS, PLACES OF WORSHIP, AND PARENT GROUPS;

	(4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

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3 4	(2) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW TO ESTABLISH CONSTRUCTIVE EDUCATIONAL AND RECREATIONAL BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES FOR CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS THROUGH PARTNERSHIPS WITH SCHOOLS, RECREATIONAL FACILITIES, LIBRARIES, NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATIONS, PLACES OF WORSHIP, AND PARENT ORGANIZATIONS;
8 9	(3) IDENTIFY PROGRAMS THAT SEEK TO ENSURE THAT CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS COME TO SCHOOL READY TO LEARN, ACQUIRE THE SKILLS NEEDED TO SUCCEED IN SCHOOL, GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL QUALIFIED FOR HIGHER EDUCATION OR FOR SKILLED AND PRODUCTIVE WORK, AND ARE PREPARED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SOCIAL AND POLITICAL LIFE OF THE COMMUNITY; AND

28	(2) THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE AN AMOUNT NOT LESS THAN \$25,000,000 IN THE FISCAL YEAR 1998 BUDGET AS AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE COMMISSION TO BE USED FOR THE AWARDING OF GRANTS AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (K) OF THIS SECTION.

11 12	(2) THE COMMISSION MAY MAKE A GRANT TO AN APPLICANT ONLY IF THE APPLICANT MEETS THE QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION.
13 14	(3) TO APPLY FOR A GRANT, AN APPLICANT SHALL SUBMIT TO THE COMMISSION AN APPLICATION IN THE FORM THAT THE COMMISSION REQUIRES.

(O) ANY PERSON OR ANY AIDER OR ABETTOR WHO VIOLATES ANY 36 PROVISION OF THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION

37 IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$50,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT

38 MORE THAN 5 YEARS OR BOTH.

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3 4	(P) (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL REPORT ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 15 OF EACH YEAR TO THE GOVERNOR, AND SUBJECT TO § 2-1312 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE BUDGET COMMITTEES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE DEPARTMENT OF FISCAL SERVICES ON THE STATUS OF THE FUND.
6	(2) THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE:
7	(I) THE TOTAL AMOUNTS OF FUNDS GENERATED;
8	(II) THE TOTAL AMOUNTS OF FUNDS EXPENDED;

15 16	(Q) (1) EACH COUNTY AND BALTIMORE CITY MAY ESTABLISH AN ADVISORY CHILDREN FIRST COMMISSION.
