- 4 FOR the purpose of delaying the termination of certain changes to the workers'
- 5 compensation benefit structure for permanent partial disability in order to continue
- 6 to exempt loss of the thumb, fingers, and great toe from the lower tier of benefits;

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 97 of the Acts of 1990, Chapter 545 of the Acts of 1992, and Chapter 171 of the Acts of
- 19 **1994**
- 20 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the changes made to §§
- 21 36(3)(c) and 36(3)(a)(i)2. of this Article, now codified as §§ 9-626, 9-627(b), and
- 22 9-628(d) of the Labor and Employment Article, take effect January 1, 1988 and shall
- 23 remain in effect for a period of [9] 13 years and, at the end of January 1, [1997] 2001,
- 24 with no further action required by the General Assembly, these changes shall be
- 25 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
- 26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 27 October 1, 1996.
