BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Health - General 15 16 19-1507. (b) In addition to any other information the Commission may require by 17 18 regulation, the medical care data base shall: 19 (1) Collect for each type of patient encounter with a health care practitioner 20 or office facility designated by the Commission: 21 (i) The demographic characteristics of the patient, EXCEPTTHAT 22 THE DATE OF BIRTH OF A PATIENT MAY NOT CONTAIN MORE THAN THE MONTH 23 AND YEAR OF BIRTH: 24 (ii) The principal diagnosis;

(iii) The procedure performed;

(v) The charge for the procedure;

(iv) The date and location of where the procedure was performed;

1 2	(vi) If the bill for the procedure was submitted on an assigned or nonassigned basis; and
3	(vii) If applicable, a health care practitioner's universal identification number;
5 6	(2) Collect appropriate information relating to prescription drugs for each type of patient encounter with a pharmacist designated by the Commission; and
7 8	(3) Collect appropriate information relating to health care costs, utilization, or resources from payors and governmental agencies.
11	(d) (1) To the extent practicable, when collecting the data requiredunder subsection (b) of this section, the Commission shall utilize any standardized claim form or electronic transfer system being used by health care practitioners, office facilities, and payors.
	(2) The Commission shall develop appropriate methods for collecting the data required under subsection (b) of this section on subscribers or enrollees of health maintenance organizations.
18	(3) FOR ANY ENCRYPTED PATIENT IDENTIFIER SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSION BY A PAYOR, HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER, OR OFFICE FACILITY, THE COMMISSION SHALL ELIMINATE THE PATIENT IDENTIFIER AFTER EDITING THE DATA FROM THE PATIENT IDENTIFIER.
