# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Higher Education - Research and Development Activities

3 FOR the purpose of altering provisions of law relating to the conflict of interest standards

- 4 applicable to officials and employees within public senior higher education
- 5 institutions who are engaged in certain research and development activities;
- 6 broadening the application of the exemption from certain ethics laws; altering the
- 7 standards for the adoption of certain policies and procedures; and generally relating
- 8 to the exemption under certain circumstances of certain individuals from provisions
- 9 of the Ethics Law.

20 Preamble

21 WHEREAS, Newly adopted federal regulations require institutions participating

22 in federally funded research to adopt certain procedures for the prevention and/or

23 management of conflicts of interest; and

24 WHEREAS, Maryland economic development requires that the State's public

25 higher education institutions be strongly encouraged to bring the results of their basic and

26 applied research to bear in the design, development, production, and marketing of new

27 and improved products, services, and processes; and

28 WHEREAS, This process will involve institutional initiatives such as

29 industry-sponsored research, incubator programs, technology licensing agreements,

30 research parks, institutional and employee ownership of equity in start-up companies,

21 technical assistance and continuing education programs, and other forms of cooperative2 economic development efforts; and

WHEREAS, These mechanisms often require working relationships between
these institutions, their faculty, and their administrators, and private sector industries,
which may be inconsistent with the strict application of provisions in the Maryland Public
Ethics Law; and

7 WHEREAS, The experience at other public and private institutions of higher
8 education has shown that these relationships can be effectively managed protect the
9 institutions and the public from damaging conflicts of interest; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OFMARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

PUBLIC SENIOR HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS AND THEIR GOVERNING
 BOARDS AND ENCOURAGED TO PROMOTE THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE
 STATE AND TO INCREASE THE FINANCIAL RESOURCES OF THE INSTITUTIONS
 THROUGH ARRANGEMENTS WITH THE PRIVATE SECTOR, INCLUDING

 INSTITUTION-OWNED INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY, AND THE PROVISIONS OF

23 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

24 (2) "[Faculty conflict] CONFLICT of interest policies" means policies25 adopted by a governing board and approved:

- 26 (i) by the Office of the Attorney General; and
- 27 (ii) as to conformity with this section, by the Ethics Commission.
- (3) "Governing board" has the meaning provided in § 10-101 of theEducation Article.

30 (4) "Educational institution" means:

31 (I) a public senior higher education institution as defined in § 10-10132 of the Education Article;

(II) A CENTER OR INSTITUTE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND

4 (3) guidelines to ensure that sponsored research or developmentdoes not 5 give improper advantage to an entity because of its affiliation or involvement with a 6 faculty member.]

7 (1) REQUIRE DISCLOSURE OF ANY INTEREST IN OR EMPLOYMENT BY
8 OR OTHER RELATIONSHIP WITH AN ENTITY FOR WHICH AN EXEMPTION UNDER
9 THIS SECTION IS CLAIMED, ON A FORM FILED WITH THE ETHICS COMMISSION AND
10 MAINTAINED AS A PUBLIC RECORD AT THE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION;

(2) REQUIRE REVIEW OF ALL DISCLOSURES BY A DESIGNATED
 OFFICIAL, WHO SHALL DETERMINE WHAT FURTHER INFORMATION MUST BE
 DISCLOSED AND WHAT RESTRICTIONS SHALL BE IMPOSED BY THE EDUCATIONAL
 INSTITUTION TO MANAGE, REDUCE, OR ELIMINATE ANY ACTUAL OR POTENTIAL
 CONFLICT OF INTEREST;

16 (3) INCLUDE GUIDELINES TO ENSURE THAT INTERESTS AND
17 EMPLOYMENT FOR WHICH AN EXEMPTION UNDER THIS SECTION IS CLAIMED DO

(4) REQUIRE APPROVAL BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE EDUCATIONAL
INSTITUTION OF ANY INTEREST OR EMPLOYMENT FOR WHICH AN EXEMPTION IS
CLAIMED UNDER THIS SECTION; AND

26 (5) REQUIRE APPROVAL BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE
27 EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION IF AN EXEMPTION IS CLAIMED BY THE PRESIDENT OF
28 THE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION.

(D) POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION MAY
PROVIDE FOR PERIODIC CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND WITH FEDERAL AGENCIES THAT HAVE IMPOSED
REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS ON FEDERALLY FUNDED RESEARCH, CONCERNING
THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SECTION.

[(d) (1)] (E) Except as provided in subsection [(e)] (F) of this section, [a
faculty member] A PRESENT OR FORMER OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE at an educational
institution may have a relationship, otherwise prohibited by this subtitle, with an entity
engaged in [sponsored] research or development, or with an entity having a direct
interest in the outcome of [sponsored] research or development, only if[:] THE
EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION HAS ADOPTED POLICIES AND PROCEDURES IN
ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION, AND THE OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE HAS
COMPLIED WITH THE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES.

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1 [(i) the relationship to the entity is disclosed publicly on a form 2 approved by and filed with the Ethics Commission, a copy of which shallbe maintained as 3 a public record by the educational institution; and

4 (ii) in accordance with the institution's faculty conflictof interest 5 procedures and the governing board's faculty conflict of interest policies, the president of 6 the educational institution approves the relationship.

7 (2)] If the provisions [of paragraph (1)] of this subsection are not met, the
8 [faculty member] OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE is not exempt from any relevant provisions
9 of this subtitle.

10 [(e) (1) This section does not exempt a faculty member from:

11 (i) the requirements of §§ 15-504(a), 15-505, and 15-506 of this 12 subtitle; or

(ii) any requirement of this subtitle as to activities notrelated tosponsored research or development.

15 (2) A relationship may not be approved if the faculty member has

16 substantial policy or management responsibility within the educational institution for the17 sponsored research or development.]

18 (F) (1) THIS SECTION DOES NOT EXEMPT AN OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE AT
19 AN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION FROM THE PROVISIONS OF § 15-505 OF THIS
20 SUBTITLE.

21 (2) AN OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE AT AN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION22 MAY NOT:

(I) REPRESENT A PARTY FOR CONTINGENT COMPENSATION IN
 ANY MATTER BEFORE THE INSTITUTION'S GOVERNING BOARD OR BEFORE THE
 BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS; OR

26 (II) INTENTIONALLY MISUSE THE INDIVIDUAL'S STATE POSITION 27 FOR THE INDIVIDUAL'S PERSONAL GAIN OR FOR THE GAIN OF ANOTHER PERSON.

(G) EACH GOVERNING BOARD SHALL REPORT ANNUALLY TO THE
GOVERNOR THE NUMBER OF APPROVALS GRANTED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF
THIS SECTION AND HOW THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICIES AND PROCEDURES
ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION HAVE BEEN IMPLEMENTED IN THE
PRECEDING YEAR.

33 (H) THIS SECTION MAY BE CITED AS THE "PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP34 ACT".

35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 36 July 1, 1996.

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
