- 4 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement, in Baltimore City, that acertain

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

	(b) The Board of License Commissioners may renew a Class B-D-7 beer, wine and liquor license that is expiring and reissue it as a Class A-2 beer, wine and liquor off-sale only package goods license as provided in § 8-203.1 of this article.(c) A Class A-2 beer, wine and liquor off-sale package goods licenseauthorizes		
5	the holder to:		
6	(1) Keep for sale and sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail; and		
	(2) Deliver alcoholic beverages in sealed packages or containers. The package or container may not be opened nor its contents be consumed on the premises where it is sold.		
10	(d) The annual license fee is \$650.		
	(e) A Class A-2 beer, wine and liquor off-sale license substituted under this section may not be converted or substituted for any other class of alcoholic beverages license, including a reversion to a Class B-D-7 beer, wine and liquor license.		
14 15	(f) A substitute license provided for under this section may not be granted after [May 1, 1993] MAY 1, 1996.		
16 17	(g) The hours during which the privileges conferred by this 6-day license may be exercised are from 9 a.m. to 12 o'clock midnight Monday through Saturday.		
	[(h) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 9-103 of this article, for purposes of zoning in Baltimore City, the operation conducted by a holder of a Class A-2 beer, wine and liquor off-sale package goods license shall be considered to be that of a tavern.]

24 25 26	(1) The Board of License Commissioners of Baltimore City may authorize the issuance of an additional license, to be known as a Class B-D-7 beer, wine and liquor license. The special license authorizes the licensee to keep for sale and sell all alcoholic beverages at retail at the place in the license described, for consumption on the premises and elsewhere, during the hours from 6 o'clock a.m. to 2 o'clock a.m. on the day following, seven days per week.		
	8 (7) (i) During [March, 1993,] MARCH 1996, the holder of an expiring Class 9 B-D-7 beer, wine and liquor license shall file with the Board of License Commissioners 0 a declaration of intent in conjunction with filing an application for license renewal.		
31 32	(ii) The declaration of intent shall request the Board of License Commissioners of Baltimore City to:		
	1. Renew the expiring license effective [May 1, 1993] MAY 1, 1996 as a Class B-D-7 beer, wine and liquor license pursuant to this section and any regulations adopted by the Board; or

- 1 (iii) A Class A-2 beer, wine and liquor off-sale license substituted under this 2 section may not be converted or substituted for any other class of alcoholic beverages
- 3 license, including a reversion to a Class B-D-7 beer, wine and liquor license.
- 4 (iv) A substitute license provided for under this subsection may not be 5 granted after [May 1, 1993] MAY 1, 1996.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 7 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has 8 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 9 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
