A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City - Regulation of Firearms**

3 FOR the purpose of exempting Baltimore City from the prohibition on local jurisdictions
4 regulating certain firearms and ammunition if the regulation is at least as stringent
5 as any applicable State regulation; authorizing the Mayor and City Council of
6 Baltimore to regulate certain firearms and ammunition under certain
7 circumstances; providing that a person subject to regulation in Baltimore City
8 remains subject to applicable State regulation; and generally relating to the
9 regulation of firearms and ammunition by Baltimore City.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments**

23 36H.

24 (a) Except as provided in subsections (b), (c), [and] (d), AND (E) of this section,
25 the State [of Maryland hereby] preempts the rights of any county, municipal
26 corporation, or special taxing district whether by law, ordinance, or regulation to regulate
27 the purchase, sale, taxation, transfer, manufacture, repair, ownership, possession, and
28 transportation of the following:

29 (1) Handgun, as defined in § 36F(b) of this article;

30 (2) Rifle, as defined in § 36F(d) of this article;

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1 (3) Shotgun, as defined in § 36F(g) of this article; and

2 (4) Ammunition and components for the above enumerated items.

3 (b) Any county, municipal corporation, or special taxing district may regulate the
4 purchase, sale, transfer, ownership, possession, and transportation of the weapons and
5 ammunition listed in subsection (a) of this section:

6 (1) With respect to minors;

7 (2) With respect to these activities on or within 100 yards of parks, churches,
8 schools, public buildings, and other places of public assembly; however, the teaching of
9 firearms safety training or other educational or sporting use may not be prohibited; and

10 (3) With respect to law enforcement personnel of the subdivision.

11 (c) To the extent that local laws or regulations do not create an inconsistency with
12 the provisions of this section or expand existing regulatory control, any county, municipal
13 corporation, or special taxing district may exercise its existing authority to amend any
14 local laws or regulations that exist before January 1, 1985.

15 (d) In accordance with law, any county, municipal corporation, or special taxing
16 district may continue to regulate the discharge of handguns, rifles, and shotguns, but may
17 not prohibit the discharge of firearms at established ranges.

18 (E) BALTIMORE CITY MAY REGULATE BY ORDINANCE THE PURCHASE, SALE,
19 TAXATION, TRANSFER, OWNERSHIP, POSSESSION, OR TRANSPORTATION OF
20 WEAPONS AND AMMUNITION LISTED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION IN
21 ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE II, § (64) OF THE CHARTER OF BALTIMORE CITY IF THE
22 REGULATION IS AT LEAST AS STRINGENT AS ANY APPLICABLE REGULATION UNDER
23 STATE LAW.

25 (a) (1) [All] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
26 SUBSECTION, ALL restrictions imposed by the laws, ordinances or regulations of all
27 subordinate jurisdictions within the State of Maryland on sales of pistols or revolvers are
28 superseded by this section, and the State of Maryland hereby preempts the rights of such
29 jurisdictions to regulate the sale of pistols and revolvers.

30 (2) BALTIMORE CITY MAY REGULATE BY ORDINANCE THE SALE OF
31 PISTOLS AND REVOLVERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE II, § (64) OF THE
32 CHARTER OF BALTIMORE CITY IF THE REGULATION IS AT LEAST AS STRINGENT AS
33 ANY APPLICABLE REGULATION UNDER STATE LAW.

35 (a) (1) [All] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
36 SUBSECTION, ALL restrictions imposed by the laws, ordinances or regulations of all
37 subordinate jurisdictions within the State of Maryland on possession or transfers by
38 private parties of pistols and revolvers are superseded by this section and the State of
39 Maryland hereby preempts the right of such jurisdictions to regulate the possession and
40 transfer of pistols and revolvers.

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1 (2) BALTIMORE CITY MAY REGULATE BY ORDINANCE THE POSSESSION
2 OR TRANSFERS BY PRIVATE PARTIES OF PISTOLS AND REVOLVERS IN ACCORDANCE
3 WITH ARTICLE II, § (64) OF THE CHARTER OF BALTIMORE CITY IF THE REGULATION
4 IS AT LEAST AS STRINGENT AS ANY APPLICABLE REGULATION UNDER STATE LAW.

5 **The Charter of Baltimore City**

6 Article II - General Powers

7 The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority to
8 exercise all of the powers heretofore or hereafter granted to it by the Constitution of
9 Maryland or by any Public General or Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland; and in
10 particular, without limitation upon the foregoing, shall have power by ordinance, or such
11 other method as may be provided for in its Charter, subject to the provisions of said
12 Constitution and Public General Laws:

13 (64) TO REGULATE THE PURCHASE, SALE, TAXATION, TRANSFER, OWNERSHIP,
14 POSSESSION, OR TRANSPORTATION OF FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION WITHIN
15 BALTIMORE CITY BY ANY PERSON IF THE REGULATION IS AT LEAST AS STRINGENT
16 AS ANY APPLICABLE REGULATION UNDER STATE LAW. ANY PERSON SUBJECT TO
17 ANY FIREARM OR AMMUNITION REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION
18 REMAINS SUBJECT TO APPLICABLE STATE REGULATIONS.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
20 October 1, 1996.
