2 Landlord and Tenant - Extension of Time for Surrender of the Premises

- 3 FOR the purpose of expanding the circumstances under which the court may extend the
- 4 time for the surrender of certain premises by a tenant to the landlord; and generally
- 5 relating to actions for the surrender of premises under the landlordand tenant laws.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article - Real Property**

19 8-401.

- 20 (c) (1) If, at the trial on the fifth day indicated in subsection (b) of this section,
- 21 the court is satisfied that the interests of justice will be better served by an adjournment
- 22 to enable either party to procure his necessary witnesses, he may adjourn the trial for a
- 23 period not exceeding one day, except that if the consent of all parties sobtained, the trial
- 24 may be adjourned for a longer period of time.
- 25 (2) If, when the trial occurs, it appears to the satisfaction of the court, that
- 26 the rent, or any part of the rent, is actually due and unpaid, the court shall determine the
- 27 amount of rent due and enter a judgment in favor of the landlord for possession of the
- 28 premises. The court may also give judgment in favor of the landlord forthe amount of
- 29 rent determined to be due together with costs of the suit if the court finds that the actual

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- 1 service of process made on the defendant would have been sufficient to support a
- 2 judgment in an action in contract or tort.
- 3 (3) The court, when entering the judgment, shall also order thetenant to
- 4 yield and render possession of the premises to the landlord, or his agent or attorney,
- 5 within two days after the trial.
- 6 (4) The court may[, upon] EXTEND THE TIME FOR SURRENDER OF THE
- 7 PREMISES FOR GOOD CAUSE AND AS JUSTICE MAY REQUIRE, INCLUDING THE
- 8 presentation of a certificate signed by a physician certifying that surrender of the
- 9 premises within this two-day period would endanger the health or life of the tenant or
- 10 any other occupant of the premises[, extend the time for surrender of the premises as
- 11 justice may require]. However, the court may not extend the time for the surrender of the
- 12 premises beyond 15 days after the trial.
- 13 (5) However, if the tenant, or someone for him, at the trial, or adjournment
- 14 of the trial, tenders to the landlord the rent determined by the court to be due and
- 15 unpaid, together with the costs of the suit, the complaint against the tenant shall be
- 16 entered as being satisfied.

- 19 (a) If, at the trial aforesaid, the judge shall be satisfied the interest of justice will
- 20 be better served by an adjournment, he may adjourn the trial for a period not exceeding
- 21 seven days, except by consent of the parties, and if at said trial or due adjournment, as
- 22 aforesaid, it shall appear to the satisfaction of the judge before whomsaid complaint has
- 23 been tried as aforesaid, that the rent or any part of the rent for saidpremises is actually
- 24 due and unpaid, then the said judge shall give judgment in favor of said lessor for the
- 25 amount of rent found due, with costs of suit, and shall order that saidtenant and all
- 26 persons claiming or holding by or under said tenant shall yield and render up possession
- 27 of said premises unto said lessor, or unto his duly qualified agent or attorney within two
- $28\,$ days thereafter; provided, however, that THE COURT MAY EXTEND THE TIME FOR
- 29 SURRENDER OF THE PREMISES FOR GOOD CAUSE AND FOR SUCH PERIOD OR 30 PERIODS AS JUSTICE MAY REQUIRE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE [upon]
- 31 presentation of A certificate signed by a practicing physician certifying that surrender of
- 32 said premises within said period of two days would endanger the health or life of any
- 33 occupant thereof, said judge may, at the trial or subsequent thereto, extend the time for
- 34 such surrender of the premises upon such terms and for such period or periods as he shall
- 35 deem necessary and just]. If the interval between the filing of the landlord's complaint
- 36 and the trial of the cause shall be more than three days, any order or judgment of said
- 37 court with respect to the payment of rent shall include all rent due and unpaid up to and
- 38 including the day of trial; and the proceedings amended to set forth the basis of said
- 39 judgment or order.
- 40 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 41 October 1, 1996.
