5	WHEREAS, The State of Maryland has a significant interest in maintaining a safe, hazard-free working environment in the ports and harbors of the State through programs to ensure that alcohol and substance abuse problems among port marine facility workers are discouraged, identified, and treated; and
	WHEREAS, Modern port marine facilities include sophisticated machinery that require highly skilled, attentive workers to operate the functions of the ports and harbors; and
12 13 14	WHEREAS, The interest of the State in an Alcohol-Free and Drug-Free Workplace Program programs at port marine facilities in the State to ensure the safe, efficient operation of port marine facilities that may attract commerce, ensure healthy workers, and encourage the rehabilitation of alcohol and drug-abusing workers is significant enough to warrant alcohol and drug testing of port marine facilities workers; now, therefore,
16 17	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
