CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Department of Natural Resources - Crab Seasons - Regulatory Authority

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Department of Natural Resources from dopting

4 regulations restricting the number of crab pots that may be set for catching crabs or

5 altering the days of the crab season under certain circumstances; making this Act an

6 emergency measure; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally

7 relating to the authority of the Department of Natural Resources to adopt

8 regulations regarding the catching of crabs.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - Natural Resources

17 4-803.

- (a) The Department may adopt rules and regulations to effectuate thefollowingpurposes:
- 20 (1) To restrict catching and possessing any blue crab;
- 21 (2) The methods by which crabs are taken;

1	(3) To close or open any specified area to catch crabs;
2	(4) To prohibit or restrict devices used to catch crabs;
3	(5) To establish seasons to catch crabs; and
6 7	(6) To establish minimum size limits for hard, soft, and peelercrabs. However, this section does not permit the Department to change existinglicense fees for catching, picking, canning, packing, or shipping cooked hard or soft crabs or crab meat; or for selling, or shipping live hard or soft crabs by barrel or crate. The Department may set license fees on types of gear or equipment if not otherwise set by law.
1 12 13	 (b) The Department's regulations may not become effective under thissection until the Department first holds public hearings. The Department shall advertise the time, place, and purpose of the hearings in one newspaper of general daily circulation in the State, and at least in one newspaper circulated in the affected region of each county whose waters may be directly affected by the proposed regulations for 2successive weeks in advance of the hearings.
1′ 18	 (C) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION OR ANY FISHERY MANAGEMENT PLAN ADOPTED UNDER § 4-215 OF THIS TITLE, AFTER THE CRAB SEASON HAS BEGUN THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT ADOPT ANY REGULATION, EXCEPT AN APPROVED EMERGENCY REGULATION UNLESS AN EMERGENCY EXISTS:
20 2	0 (1) RESTRICTING THE NUMBER OF CRAB POTS THAT A PERSON MAY S 1 FOR CATCHING CRABS; OR
22	2 (2) ALTERING THE DAYS OF THE CRAB SEASON.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency

24 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has

25 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three fifths of all the members elected to

26 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is

27 enacted.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 29 October 1, 1996.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall remain 30 31 effective until March 31, 1999 and, at the end of March 31, 1999, with no further action 32 required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of nofurther force

33 and effect.

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
