House Bill 231 (Delegate Campbell, et al.)
Judiciary

Crimes - Unlawful Taking of a Motor Vehicle - Penalty

This bill increases the maximum incarceration penalty for the felony of taking a motor vehicle from 5 to 15 years.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Indeterminate increase in general fund expenditures due to the bill's penalty provision. Revenues would not be affected.

Local Effect: None.

Fiscal Analysis

State Expenditures: General fund expenditures could increase as a result of the bill's incarceration penalty due to people being committed to a Division of Correction (DOC) facility for longer periods of time, depending upon the number of convictions and sentences imposed.

In fiscal 1997 the average monthly cost per inmate is estimated at \$1,400. Under the bill's maximum incarceration penalty, the average time served would increase from 30 to 60 months (50% of the maximum sentence with the possibility of parole), or by 30 months. Thus, State costs could increase by \$42,000 (\$1,400 x 30) for each person imprisoned under the bill.
