## Landlord and Tenant - Restitution of Premises - Breach of Lease

This enrolled bill expands provisions of the law pertaining to the repossession of leased premises by a landlord by specifying the manner in which a summons is to be served, after notice has been sent to the tenant or person in possession of the property by first-class mail, in the event that either person cannot be found.
