Prince George's County - State's Attorney's Office - Salaries PG 305-96

This amended bill increases the maximum salary of Prince George's County Deputy State's Attorneys from \$79,300 to \$86,500 and the maximum salary of the Assistant State's Attorneys from \$70,200 to \$77,850. The bill also increases the maximum salary of the Administrative Assistant from \$40,200 to \$47,000. The bill is effective July 1, 1996.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Prince George's County expenditures could increase by \$57,300 in FY 1997. Out-year expenditures could increase by an indeterminate, substantial amount. Revenues would not be affected.

Fiscal Analysis

Local Expenditures: Prince George's County expenditures would increase by \$57,331 in fiscal 1997 if the salaries for two Deputy State's Attorneys, eight Assistant State's Attorneys, and an Administrative Assistant are increased by the Prince George's County State's Attorney. Prince George's County advises the salary of the Deputy State's Attorneys and the Administrative Assistant would be increased to the proposed maximum amounts, while the salaries of the Assistant State's Attorneys who are at or near the current maximum would be increased by 5.5%. The estimate is based upon the following:

Out-year expenditures could increase if the Prince George's County State's Attorney increases the salaries of the Assistant State's Attorneys. Although the actual salary increases cannot be determined beforehand, the expenditure increase could be substantial.
