House Bill 1122 (Delegate Finifter) Judiciary

Estates and Trusts - Attorney in Fact - Gifts

This bill authorizes an attorney in fact or agent to make gifts of the principal's property if a written power of attorney: (1) authorizes any act that the principal may do; or (2) evidences the principal's intent to give full power over their affairs or property. The bill limits and circumscribes the amount of a gift that attorneys or agents may make to themselves.

The bill also allows an attorney in fact or agent to petition a circuit court for authority to make gifts of the principal's property consistent with the express terms of the power of attorney or other writings. Relevant factors for consideration by the court are delineated.
