House Bill 1272 (Delegate E. Burns, et al.)

Campaign Contributions - Casino Gaming

This bill makes a person who contributes to a political campaign ineligible to receive from the State any form of license or permit to conduct casino gaming for a period of three years from the date the person made the contribution.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The State currently does not issue any form of permit or license for casino gaming. To the extent that casino gaming permits are issued in the future, revenues could be foregone if (1) licenses are not issued as a result of this bill; and (2) the issuance of such license would have led directly or indirectly to an increase in State revenues.

Local Effect: None. The State currently does not issue any form of permit or license for casino gaming. To the extent that casino gaming permits are issued in the future, revenues could be foregone if (1) licenses are not issued as a result of this bill; and (2) the issuance of such license would have led directly or indirectly to an increase in local revenues.
