Suspension of a Juvenile's Driving Privileges - Vehicle Theft Offense

This bill requires suspension of the driver's license of a juvenile who is adjudicated delinquent for theft of a motor vehicle.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Transportation Trust Fund Revenues could increase by an estimated \$29,250 annually beginning in FY 1999. The workload increase stemming from additional suspension actions could be handled with existing resources.

Local Effect: None.

Fiscal Analysis

State Revenues: The Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) estimates that an additional 600 to 700 licenses will be suspended each year under this bill based on fiscal 1995 data. The MVA collects a \$15 fee for an application to reinstate a license, plus \$30 for reinstatement after a suspension. Assuming 650 people apply and have their licenses reinstated after the revocation period, Transportation Trust Fund revenues could increase by \$29,250 annually. Any increase in revenue would not begin until fiscal 1999, as the revocation period for a first offense is two years.
