House Bill 214 (Allegany County Delegation) Ways and Means

Property Taxes - Constant Yield Tax Rate - County Advertisement Requirements

This bill changes the size requirements to which counties and Baltimore City must adhere when publishing advertisements to set the county property tax rate above the constant yield tax rate. It reduces the required size of the advertisement from 1/4 of a page to 1/8 of a page.

This bill is effective July 1, 1996.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. This bill does not affect State operations.

Local Effect: County advertising costs would be reduced by a minimal amount. Revenues would not be affected.

Fiscal Analysis

Local Expenditures: Four counties and Baltimore City have provided the Department of Fiscal Services with estimates of advertising expenditures that would be saved as a result of this bill. They are as follows:
