Domestic Violence - Enforcement of Out-of-State Protective Orders

This enrolled bill requires that protective orders from another state or an Indian tribe must be accorded full faith and credit by a Maryland court. Such orders shall be enforced only to the extent permitted under current State law, and are authorized to be entered in the Maryland Interagency Law Enforcement System.

A Maryland law enforcement officer must arrest a person whom the officer has probable cause to believe is in violation of such orders, if specified conditions are met.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill's requirements can be handled with the existing budgeted resources of the Judiciary and Maryland law enforcement agencies.
