House Bill 905 (Delegate Bozman, et al.)
Economic Matters

Worcester County - Alcoholic Beverages
(Multiple Licenses)

This bill allows a bona fide homeowner's association in Worcester County that owns more than one amenity to hold multiple Class B licenses, Class C licenses, or a combination of both. Admission to an amenity licensed with a Class C license is limited to owners of real property governed by recorded covenants of the association, their tenants, and their guests.

The bill is effective June 1, 1996.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Worcester County revenues could increase due to the collection of additional license fees from the issuance of multiple licenses to homeowner's associations. The revenue increase would depend upon the number of multiple licenses, the type of licenses, and the amount of the application and license fees. Although this information is not available at this time, the revenue increase is assumed to be minimal. The Board of License Commissioners could issue the multiple licenses and monitor licensees with existing resources.
