House Bill 96 (Chairman, Commerce and Government Matters Committee) (Departmental - Transportation)

Commerce and Government Matters

Drivers' Licenses - Testing for Motorcycle Permits and Licenses - Waiver

This departmental bill eliminates the requirement that a person applying for a motorcycle driver's license first receive a learner's permit if the person successfully completes a Motorcycle Safety course.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None, as discussed below.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: The Department of Transportation has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). Fiscal Services concurs with this assessment.

Fiscal Analysis

State Effect: The Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) estimates that this bill would eliminate the need to issue 3,300 motorcycle learner's permits annually. This reduction is not expected to have a significant impact on MVA workload. In addition, it is not expected to have a demonstrable effect on Transportation Trust Fund revenues as a motorcycle driver's license issued after a person has received a \$30 learner's permit is free and the fee for a motorcycle license issued to a person who did not have a learner's permit is \$30.
