# FISCAL NOTE Revised

House Bill 236 (Delegate Turner) Judiciary

Referred to Judicial Proceedings

### Juvenile Law - Drivers' Licenses - Drinking or Possessing Intoxicating Beverages on School Premises

This amended bill makes suspension of a minor's driver's license mandatory if the minor is found to have been drinking or possessing intoxicating beverages on school property. In addition, the bill provides that a suspension period for a juvenile without a driver's license begins on the date the juvenile turns 16.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Transportation Trust Fund revenues could increase by an indeterminate amount. The workload increase stemming from additional suspension actions could be handled with existing resources.

Local Effect: None.

#### **Fiscal Analysis**

**State Revenues:** The Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) collects a \$15 fee for an application to reinstate a license, plus \$30 for reinstatement. Assuming that all the people whose licenses are revoked apply to and have their licenses reinstated after the revocation period, Transportation Trust Fund revenues could increase.
