# FISCAL NOTE Revised

House Bill 706 (Prince George's County and Montgomery County Delegations)Commerce & Government MattersReferred to Economic & Environmental Affairs

#### Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission - Minority Business Enterprise Program - Compliance Officer PG/MC 43-96

This amended bill requires the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) to appoint a compliance officer for minority business contracts.

The bill takes effect July 1, 1996 and sunsets June 30, 1997.

### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Potential increase in expenditures. Revenues would not be affected.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

**Local Expenditures:** The WSSC reports that this bill would necessitate the creation of a new position. Estimated additional payroll costs for this appointment are \$62,500, which includes a 25% overhead cost. However, the Department of Fiscal Services (DFS) advises that the WSSC currently has an MBE office with an employee who meets with potential MBE contractors and otherwise fulfills most of the duties that would be assigned to an MBE compliance officer. Therefore, this employee could likely be appointed the "MBE compliance officer" and assume any of the required duties that are not already performed without any additional payroll costs.
