House Bill 1056 (Delegate Hurson) Commerce and Government Matters

## **General Assembly - Legislation with Impact on Children - Economic Analysis**

This bill requires the appropriate executive agency to prepare an impact on children rating and impact on children analyses, if appropriate, for Administration and departmental bills beginning with the 1997 session of the General Assembly. The Department of Fiscal Services is required to prepare ratings and analyses for every non-Administration and nondepartmental bill beginning with the 1998 session. If the rating is minimal or no distinctive impact only a brief statement would be required. If the rating is "distinctive" an analysis would be prepared. The impact may be described in general terms, and need not be quantified. Units of State and local governments are required to provide the Department of Fiscal Services with assistance and information if requested. The ratings and analyses may be included as part of a fiscal note.

This bill is effective July 1, 1996.
